

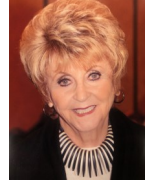

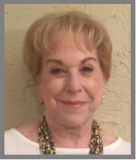

Meet Sandy Scherling



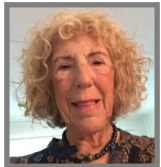
